

DEAR FRIENDS,

In 2019, Port Discovery Children's Museum underwent our first major renovation since we opened 23 years ago! To provide the children and families of Maryland with new and innovative hands-on experiences, the Museum unveiled a long-awaited Port-themed exhibit paying homage to the 300-year-old industry that created Baltimore. We also unveiled a new **SkyClimber**, and major renovations to public spaces throughout the Museum including restrooms, the nursing area, the lunchroom, and the lobby.

Equally important, we continued to invest in our surrounding community by advancing and expanding our free and reduced admission programs. We also expanded our outreach offerings and partnerships allowing us to reach children who have never been involved with the museum before.

All of our worlds changed in the Spring of 2020 due to the Covid-19 global pandemic and the museum had to temporarily close our doors on March 13 -- but how we could continue to serve our children and families everywhere was on our minds and in our hearts.

While we couldn't invite guests back into the museum, we were able to bring families exciting, playful, and fun virtual Creative Art Activities, Music and Movement, Theatre, Early Literacy and Storytimes, Health and Wellness, and STEM activities designed to help children continue learning while they were at home.

Our community partnerships helped Port Discovery reach the children who needed us most in innovative ways. With distribution partners like The Hunger Project and funders like Baltimore Community Foundation, we distributed PlayPacks to low-income Baltimore families with young children. We also partnered in the Baltimore Summer Arts Passports project, leveraging the power of creativity to keep children emotionally healthy during this stressful time. Our staff delivered hundreds of Passports to Heart's Place for inclusion, along with art supplies, in the nonprofit's "weekend survival kits" providing food and toiletries for homeless children at sites across Baltimore. We delivered virtual early literacy programs, PlayPacks, and much-needed family meals to the homes of early learners enrolled in Baltimore City Judy Centers last fall with support from PNC. And most recently, we began a partnership with Belair-Edison School to support a group of Baltimore City youth as they built leadership skills and document their pandemic experiences as members of the Next Generation Youth Advisory Council with support from Baltimore Children and Youth Fund.

As always, our work would not be possible without the ongoing commitment of our dedicated staff, board of directors, donors, members, and our numerous community partners across the region. We thank you for being part of our past years and we're honored that you have been on this journey with us. Your continued support has made it possible.

NUMBERS AT A GLANCE

By the numbers, PRE COVID July 2019* - March 2020

39% of Port Discovery's non-member guests received free or significantly reduced admission through the Museum's combined access initiatives.

34,000 quests took advantage of completely free admission.

Almost **70%** of all public school groups that visited Port Discovery on a field trip were from schools with Title I designations.

16% of field trip groups to Port Discovery came from out of state.

53.2% of field trips groups to Port Discovery came from outside of Central Maryland.

Almost 8% of field trips groups to Port Discovery came from Washington, DC.

5,802 children and families visited Port Discovery's **Pop-Up Play Space at the Shops at Kenilworth** in Baltimore County between February and May.

By the numbers, COVID March 2020 - June 2020**

- 1,310 individually assembled project kits packed, bundled into series bags for YMCA of Central Maryland.
- 48 Belair Edison PlayPacks packed and delivered to school for distribution.
- 2,600 PlayPacks were distributed in partnership with The Hunger Project and Weekend Backpacks for Homeless Kids.
- 86 live virtual Museum on the Road sessions.
- * The museum was closed January - June of 2019 for renovations.

Program Highlight, Theater Program

More than a silly play, we create a space in which children's ideas and voices are heard, respected, and amplified with a robust schedule of in-house and guest performances. When children are given the props and tools to do dramatic play they are given the freedom to explore their world and give new feelings a try. Every child is an actor when playing make believe, but they also experience firsthand that dramatic play is much more than acting, they can operate props, build set pieces, and try out more facets of theater beyond actual performing.





NEAR AND FAR

Port Discovery Children's Museum is and will continue to be an important part of the region beyond the museum walls.

236,452 visitors to the Hereford, Perry Hall, and Towson branches of the Baltimore County Public Library had the opportunity to interact with *Nano*, Port Discovery's traveling nanoscience exhibit.

Port Discovery's 13-week series of STEM learning provided to students through the Baltimore Library Project clocked in as the longest consecutive series of enrichment programming that Port Discovery has ever offered.

Port Discovery expanded its reach to Western Maryland, providing circus-themed school assemblies to **2,400** students at **6** Washington County schools.

Port Discovery hosted 56 different outside groups and performers at the Museum.

Port Discovery's *Museum on the Road* and *After School* programming reached over **41%** more children and families than in FY18.

Outreach to children and families in Anne Arundel County increased by over **150%**, providing *Museum on the Road* programming to over **1,200** children.

Outreach to children and families in Baltimore City increased by over **13%**, providing *Museum on the Road* and *After School* programming to over **7,000** children.

Outreach to children and families in Howard County increased by almost **40%**, providing *Museum on the Road* programming to over **350** children.

Outreach to children and families in Prince George's County increased by over **14%**, providing *Museum on the Road* programming to almost **950** children.

Outreach to children and families on the Eastern Shore increased by over **117%**, providing *Museum on the Road* programming to almost **950** children.



Barb, Program Highlight, After School Enrichment

The term "after school" doesn't cover what our outreach team provides to schools across the region. Our talented outreach team has the training to inspire and become an educational game changer. To many kids, a visit from Port Discovery Children's Museum is the day that math, science, or art concepts finally "click" inspiring lifelong curiosity. Each of our 5 session series begins way before our staff makes it into the classroom and extends well after the series ends. Unlike other out of the box programs, our talented staff constantly refreshes our program offerings and makes every effort to connect with what students are learning in and out of the classroom- making a visit from Port Discovery Children's Museum a memorable and enriching after school experience.


