

There are fun things to see and do!








I toss in the bean bags. I toss them in the holes.

I can play with a puzzle. Putting puzzles together can be fun.






I can work at a farmer's market. I can sell fruits and vegetables.

I can play with a friend or by myself.




I push the yellow button to start. I push the white button to milk the cow. I can see the screen to see how fast.





Milking the cow game can be fun!






I can pretend to be a farmer. I can ride the tractor.

Overview:

Scripted stories help children understand how to respond and interact in unfamiliar situations, activities or events. These stories are written to assist children in social situations. When children are more prepared and understand the expectations of a situation this helps to minimize possible problem behaviors that might occur. These stories can be utilized by teachers, parents and child care providers.

These stories are a tool to help a child prepare for a new situation and to address a challenging behavior within that new setting or situation. These scripted stories can be modified. Real photographs can be used instead of clip art. Please note that you can use real photographs of the child and change the wording to make it more personalized for your child or a student.
